### Welcome from Madam Chair Dr. Rym Kaki

I hope to find you all in good health and spirit. It is with honor and immense pleasure that I have accepted in March 2019 to lead the newly formed Section on African Public Administration (SAPA) under the umbrella of the American Society of Public Administration (ASPA). SAPA was officially inaugurated in March 2018, at Denver, Colorado. It came into existence to meet a long held collective dream, that is to create a distinct forum led by a dedicated circle of African Diaspora, American, and global pracademics with a shared goal of exploring the 55 African countries' most pressing public and nonprofit sector governance, management, and leadership issues. In the span of three years, and thanks to its members' collective mobilization and engaged teamwork, SAPA doubled its membership, diversified its advisory board governance, mainstreamed its internal processes, organized into specialized subcommittees, each working to further SAPA's strategic goals and expand its outreach in Africa and globally.

We held our first Round Table on "African Development Governance: Lessons Learned" in Washington D.C. in March 2019 under ASPA annual conference in collaboration with GW Elliot School of Public Affairs and USC Sol Price School of Public Policy IPPAM Program, bringing together scholars, political officials, think tank researchers and students to weigh in on a rich palette of hot-button public sector governance issues facing selected African countries. In 2020 and due to Covid-19 pandemic disruptions, SAPA pivoted online and conducted its first ZOOM-powered Symposium on "Vision 2020 for Africa's Development Transformation: Challenges and Opportunities" captivating the attention of a globally scattered audience over fresh- and forward-looking conversations about public sector governance, multisectoral collaboration, community participation, ethical leadership, and sustainable development.

Our SAPA website has had a facelift. We successfully brokered a collaborative agreement with the African Association for Public Administration and Management (AAPAM) as well as with the Editorial Board of the African Journal of Public Administration and Management (AJPAM), with the goal of jointly organizing continent-based symposia, conferences and publications. The partnership is facilitated by the already established MOU binding ASPA with AAPAM. In a nutshell, despite the disruptions experienced since the pandemic began, SAPA has demonstrated endurance and creativity. "It always seems impossible until it's done," as Nelson Mandela once said.




